:: GRANTS ::

Travel Oregon Matching Grant Program

An annual awards program for up to \$10,000 in matching funds for projects that fulfill one of Travel Oregon's strategic objectives and help achieve the organization's mission which is "to encourage economic growth and to enhance the quality of life in Oregon through a strengthened economic impact of tourism throughout the state." Deadline is typically in early August. Google 'Travel Oregon Matching Grant' for more information.

Cycle Oregon Grant

The Cycle Oregon grant fund supports two main causes: projects in communities through which Cycle Oregon rides, and bicycling advocacy and projects in Oregon. With more than \$1.5 million currently in the fund, Cycle Oregon disburses approximately \$100,000 each year in grants that spotlight the kind of endeavors that frequently lack statewide attention but often mean everything to the people in the small towns who welcome us on our tours. USDA Rural Business Enterprise Grants (RBEG) Program

The RBEG program provides grants for rural projects that finance and facilitate development of small and emerging rural businesses help fund business incubators, and help fund employment related adult education programs. To assist with business development, RBEGs may fund a broad array of activities. Google name of program.

County Opportunity Grants

County Opportunity grants go to Oregon counties to purchase land for campgrounds, to improve or plan camping areas, and other, similar purposes. The grant, which comes from a portion of RV registration fees, has been funding Oregon campground projects yearly since 1983.

Local Government Grants

OPRD gives more than \$4 million annually to Oregon communities for outdoor recreation projects, and has awarded nearly \$50 million in grants across the state since 1999. The grants are funded from voter-approved Lottery money.

Recreational Trails Grants

Recreational Trails Grants are national grants administered by OPRD for recreational trail-related projects, such as hiking, running, bicycling, off-road motorcycling, and all-terrain vehicle riding. Yearly grants are awarded based on funds voted on by the U.S. Congress.
