Allotment: The number of hotel rooms available for sale by an agent or supplier.

Best Available Rate (BAR): The lowest non-restricted rate bookable by all guests. This rate can change several times a week or day. Also called Best Flexible Rate (BFR).

Group Rates: Negotiated rates (usually discounted against standard rates) for group travel based on an agreed upon minimum number of rooms booked.

Net Rate: A wholesale rate to allow a third-party markup.

Complimentary Room (Comp): A guest room for which no charge is made. Complimentary rooms are usually given when a group blocks a number of rooms.

Package:

- 1. Pre-arranged combination of elements such as air, hotel, sightseeing, and social events put together and sold at an all-inclusive package price.
- 2. To package, meaning to combine elements as above into an all-inclusive package product.

Partnering: A partnership to cooperate in producing a travel package such as a hotel that partners with an attraction or rental car; also known as a co-op.

Length of Stay (LOS): The duration of a guest's visit (e.g., three nights).

Minimum Length of Stay (MLOS): The shortest bookable duration of a visit.

Pax: Number of people/passengers (e.g., "six pax" would indicate six people/passengers).

PP: Per person.

PPPN: Per person, per night.

Rack Rate: The standard or default rate for a room, before any discounts (e.g., advance purchase discounts) are applied.

Room Block: A group of rooms reserved in advance; typically for group tour or corporate purposes.

Releasing Rooms: To release blocked rooms, normally on an agreed upon date prior to check-in.

Incidentals: Additional hotel charges such as room service. *It's always important to confirm guests are responsible for incidentals before they check-in to the hotel.*

Courtesy Room Blocks: A room block that does not require a deposit or formal agreement. This is most common for a block of less than 30 rooms.

Deposits: A deposit guarantees a reservation. *Negotiate to ensure the deposit is at least partially refundable.*



No-Walk Penalty Clause: Clause that ensures a reservation or room block is protected, even if another party wishes to reserve rooms.

Ownership Change Clause: Clause that grants the option to back out of a reservation or room block if hotel ownership changes after the agreement was made.

Hotel Maintenance Clause: Clause that states the hotel must be in the same or better condition at check-in as it was upon making reservation.

Allowable Shrinkage Clause: Clause that states the number of rooms that may be un-booked without penalties. Allowable shrinkage is best under 20%.

Attrition Rate or Minimum Commitment: The percentage or number of rooms that must be filled to avoid a penalty fee. *The target attrition rate is* 80%-90%.

Cut-Off Date: The date that rooms in a block, that are not yet reserved, will be released. A typical cut-off date is 30-days prior to check-in.

Hotel Classification: There is no official classification or accepted rating system for U.S. hotels, but the following definitions are generally understood:

- Budget or Tourist: Budget hotels/motels are reasonably priced accommodations. In general, they provide a room with a bed and bath, TV set, and telephone, as well as free parking. They usually do not have room service or a restaurant.
- Moderate: Accounts for nearly 75% of available U.S. hotel rooms. Offer on-site restaurants, bars, and perhaps a conference room, as well as other basic services.
- **Deluxe**: A top-grade hotel with all rooms usually having a private bath. The public rooms and services are provided, and a high standard of décor and services are maintained.
- **First-Class or Luxury**: Many first-class/luxury hotels in the U.S. exist in large cities, offering a number of special services to the business/leisure travelers. They offer amenities like first-rate restaurants, banquet and conference rooms, valet service, room service, cable TV and complimentary morning news.
