Yachats Area Trolley


- Purchased with grants from Travel Oregon and the Oregon Coast Visitor Association.

- Provides hiking opportunities for visitors and locals.




What is the Estuary Walkway Project?

- Safety: Improves pedestrian safety.
- Connectivity: Offers crucial links between neighborhoods, parks, and other key locations, encouraging community interaction.
- Completion of the Oregon Coast Trail (OCT): Finalizes the OCT in Region 5.
- Creation of a new recreational opportunity: As an ADA-accessible amenity, it promotes inclusivity and equal access to nature.

Little Log Church Museum









Indigenous History

- The Little Log Church will feature an exhibit highlighting the Indigenous history of our region.
- The exhibit is being curated by local group, View the Future, with supervision from both local tribes— Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians and Confederated Tribes of Coos, Lower Umpqua, and Siuslaw.
- The exhibit will share: Pre-European Contact, The Prison Camp Years, and Current Day for the Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians and Confederated Tribes of Coos, Lower Umpqua, and Siuslaw.
- A ceremony was held where the City of Yachats gifted back all of the artifacts that were once housed at the Little Log Church Museum
- The City collaborates with View the Future and both tribes on the Annual Peace Hike.



Property Purchases

- Purchase of the old Landmark Property (previously Beulah's).
- Lease of 25 acres to protect the backdrop of Yachats from clearcutting.
- The City recently received jurisdiction over Ocean View Drive from Lincoln County.
 - Added parks with benches and views
 - Created separated walkway
- Major investment in new library: 40% of checkouts in summer are visitors


